WHO MAY COMPETE:

Open to any individual that meets the eligibility requirements specified under CMP Rules. A notarized Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Agreement must be on file for each competitor per CMP Rules. FACILITIES:

25 firing points, paved and controlled by a loudspeaker system, with electronically controlled turning targets. The firing points are covered and restrooms are available.

TIME:

Registration starts at 8:00 a.m. at the 25/50 yd. covered firing line. The first relay for the Military and Police SP match will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m. The second relay will begin at approximately 10:00 a.m. The CMP Excellence-In-Competition (EIC) match will begin at approximately 11:00 a.m. or immediately following the third relay of the Military and Police Service Pistol match.

Entry fees include all CMP sanctioning and competitor entry fees.

AWARDS:

Military and Police Service Pistol Match: Plaques will be given to the match winner, second and third place. CMP achievement medals (gold, silver and bronze) will be awarded according to the CMP minimum scores for the awards as follows:

Gold: 365+

Silver: 335-364

Bronze: 310-334

For the CMP EIC Match: Credit toward Distinguished Pistol Shot designation. Excellence-In-Competition Badges will be provided by the CMP for those who qualify. Points towards the Distinguished Pistol Shot designation will be awarded per CMP rules and regulations.

COURSE OF FIRE:

Military and Police Service Pistol Match

All stages are fired at 25 yds. on the B8 target

Stage 1: Position, standing, with one or two handed grip; 5 sighters/5 min.; 10 shots 5+5/ 5 min.

Stage 2: Position, standing, with left single hand grip; 10 shots (5+5) / 5 min.

Stage 3: Position, standing, with right hand grip; 10 shots (5+5) / 5 min.

Stage 4: Position, standing, with one or two handed grip; 10 shots (5+5) / 70 sec.

CMP EIC Match (30 shots, no sighters)

10 shots / 10 min. at 50 yds. on B6 target; standing one handed.

10 shots (5+5) at 25 yds.; 20 sec. / 5 shots (timed fire) on B8 target; standing one handed.

10 shots (5+5) at 25 yds.; 10 sec. / 5 shots (rapid fire) on B8 target; standing one handed.

ARMS/AMMUNITION:

Military and Police Service Pistol Match:

Pistols must be semi-auto pistols that are practical or suitable for issue as a military or police service pistol. The pistol must comply with the following requirements:

- Pistol calibers cannot be smaller than 9mm or larger than .45 cal.;
- Barrels may not be more than 5 inches in length;
- Pistols must have a single or striker action trigger pull of not less than 4.0 lbs. (Glock and Springfield Armory XD pistols with barrels no longer than 5 inches are permitted);
- Pistols may not be match conditioned;
- Pistols must be equipped with standard issue non-adjustable sights;
- Ammunition used must be loaded with full metal jacket round nose bullets.

EIC "Leg" Match: (CMP Rules 6.5, 6.6 and 6.8)

Competitors may use .45 M1911/M1911A1 or 9mm M9/M9A1 as issued by the U.S. Armed Forces or the commercial pistol of the same type and caliber, having not less than a 4 pound trigger pull. Competitors may use any safe .45 cal., 230 grain FMJ round nosed bullet or 9mm, 115 to 125 grain FMJ round nosed bullet, as applicable.

SCORING OF CHALLENGED SHOTS:

The plug-type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by range personnel only.

- All firing will be governed by CMP Rules, as applicable. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with such rules as well as those imposed by the Match Director.
- Challenge Fee of \$2.00 will be returned if the challenge is sustained.
- Jury system will be used;
- All events will be squadded.
